
- 5 different balloon sculptures over seven feet high were delivered to build a "Bridge" on the stage.

### **Making Room for 144 More - Kid Ware**





The Summer Staffers who are going with us are writing letters trying to raise the funds for the trip. We are asking each staffer to raise \$1,800.00. There are a lot of expenses in a trip like this. We transport everything by boat (water, food, supplies, and even the cooks!) We hire boat drivers to pick up children from 6 different villages and take them to the camp location. From all of us here at Camp Copass we wanted to put them front and center! Thank you so much ladies for your never ending dedication to Camp Copass! We love you and Thank you!!!












