We surely didn't see that coming! Because our income came to an abrupt halt, we made the decision to stop construction on New Hope Dorm. We needed the money set aside for building the dorm to be used to keep the lights on and the bills paid!

We just finished our Summer Camp 2021 and things are starting to get back to normal. But the New Hope Dorm is still unfinished. We need \$217,000 to complete the building that will hold 84 kids and is very much needed!
