PARTNERING WITH CHURCHES

Churches should also ensure that retreatants have not traveled out of the country or in areas where COVID 19 has been concentrated within the past month.

We recommend that a church not send anyone to camp with a compromised immune system.

GOOD HYGIENE

Hand sanitizers are available throughout the camp.

Face masks are recommended indoors including the dining hall until guests are seated.

Guests should respect the personal space of others.

BUILDING SANITATION

Keeping Camp Copass safe for our guests begins with the staff.

We will be sanitizing all congregating areas including the Dining Hall before and after each use.

Our staff uses a mist disinfectant which is effective in killing the coronavirus within 10 seconds.
